We began by offering a two-day row boat as well as a one-day pirogue—pronounced pea-row. It is shaped like a canoe and some people love it. At our very first class, PBS was here filming, and it has been going strong ever since.

Every event we host is like a festival here at our Grand View Farm. People thank us over and over again for the marvelous exposure to this type of work, for the memories of the best vacation they've ever had, for giving them one more weekend with the kids before going off to college, for teaching the younger kids about tools, how to work with them and how to take care of them.

Our boat school is all about reaching back to the kids. About giving the next generation the opportunity to enjoy the water as we all have. And it's about making memories so they, too, can reach back and help the generation after their's.
